The Basics

What is a Trusted Advisor?

A Trusted Advisor is a small group of business owners and executives meeting monthly to address their business and personal issues from a Biblical perspective. They operate somewhat like a Christian Board of Advisors.

When do Trusted Advisors meet?

A Trusted Advisor group usually meets once a month for 4 to 5 hours (e.g. 11:30am-4:30pm), on a fixed date (e.g. the last Thursday of each month).

How many are in a Trusted Advisor?

A typical Trusted Advisor has only eight to twelve members. This size gives each man ample opportunity to present timeley and important issues each month. The monthly expectation is that each man will receive godly counsel for important, pending decisions or actions.

Must each member be a Christian?

Yes. The counsel given and received should be based on a solid relationship with Jesus Christ.

Who leads a Trusted Advisor group?

In an effort to provide members with a truly valuable experience, each group has a trained moderator. The moderator is responsible for creating an environment that fosters openness, transparency and full participation by each man.

What is a typical agenda?

- 1. Devotional
- 2. In depth discussion of one member's issue
- 3. Discussion of issues facing the other members
- 4. Prayer

What are the commitments?

Upon joining a Trusted Advisor, each member agrees to...

- Honor God in their business and personal life
- Be accountable to the Trusted Advisor group
- Be involved in the dialogue and in the other members' lives
- Financially support the CBMC Trusted Advisor ministry (\$150/month fee)
- Attend faithfully and be on time to meetings
- Maintain strict confidentiality

Godly Counsel

Draw on the wisdom, giftedness and experience of the men in your group. *A wise man welcomes instruction and reproof. Proverbs 9:8-9*

Accountability
